<u>Latin alphabet</u>: **Times New Roman**

Greek alphabet: Times New Roman, HellenicaU [or any other

<u>Unicode</u> font]

Hebrew alphabet: Times New Roman, Bwhebb, EzraSil

Arabic alphabet: Times New Roman

<u>For all other alphabets</u>: please, attach a copy of the font file when you submit your contribution.

Guidelines for footnotes/bibliography citations

• Monograph:

→ Author, *Title*, Publisher, Place Year, page/s.

E.g.: M.E. McCullough, *Beyond Revenge: The Evolution of the Forgiveness Instinct*, Jossey-Bass, San Francisco 2008, pp. 88-111.

• Article:

→ Author, *Title*, in «Name of the journal» issue number(year), page/s.

E.g.: B. Weiner et al., *Public Confession and Forgiveness*, in «Journal of Personality» 59(1991), pp. 281-312.

• Contribution in a collective work:

→ Author, *Title of contribution*, in Author/Editor, *Title of the collective work*, Publisher, Place Year, page/s.

E.g. J.G. Murphy, Forgiveness, Self-Respect, and the Value of Resentment, in E.L. Worthington (ed.), Handbook of Forgiveness, Routledge, New York 2005, pp. 33-40.

2 Editorial Rules

— when possible, please put the editor/s (always ed. or eds., not éd., Hrsg., etc.) before the title: E.g.:

- D. Wenham, The Christian Life: A Life in Tension? A Consideration of the Christian Experience in Paul, in **D.A. Hagner M.J. Harris (eds.)**, Pauline Studies: Essays Presented to Professor F.F. Bruce on his 70th Birthday, Eerdmans, Grand Rapids, Mi. 1980, pp. 80-94.
- the name of the collection or book series has to be included in parentheses, immediately after the title. E.g.:
 - J.F. Gaertner, Writing Exile: The Discourse of Displacement in Greco-Roman Antiquity and Beyond (Mnemosyne, Supplements 283), Brill, Leiden 2007.

In particular, in footnotes:

- the first time you cite a text, you shall indicate author's Name/s [initial/s without space] and Last name/s: M.E. McCullough, B. Weiner, etc.
- when the book has already been mentioned, you shall report author's Name [initial/s without space] Surname, *First word/s of the work*, cit. E.g.:
 - M.E. McCullough, Beyond Revenge, cit., pp. 32-33.
- in case you cite another work by the same author, you won't report again the author's name but you shall write Id./Ead. E.g.:
 - P. Schäfer, *Synopse zur Hekhalot-Literatur*, Mohr Siebeck, Tübingen 1981; **Id.**, *Tradition and Redaction in Hekhalot Literature*, in «JSJ» 14/2 (1983), pp. 172-181.
- in case you cite a work you have just cited, you shall write *ibi*, page/s. E.g.:
 - ²³ M.E. McCullough, Beyond Revenge, cit., pp. 32-33.
 - ²⁴ *Ibi*, pp. 34-35.
- in case you cite a work you have just cited, exactly the same page/s, you shall write *ibidem*.
 - ²³ M.E. McCullough, *Beyond Revenge*, cit., pp. 32-33.
 - ²⁴ Ibidem.
